Reminder of the regulations in force which must be applied by all Shippers/Forwarders using Electronic Monitoring Devices:

- Identify data-transmitting Electronic Monitoring Devices by the IATA special handling code 'EMD'. EMD stands for 'Electronic Monitoring Device'
- Mention the brand and exact reference/type (not only general reference) of EMD:
 - o In the (X)FWB: in OSI and/or SSR field, examples below:
